Hoping that as the TDSB moves back to a regular schedule in Semester 2 this will give RUSTCO the opportunity to engage in longer planning sessions during lunch hours and the opportunity to plan events that can accommodate more students. RUSTCO will think about how the Parent Council can provide even more support.
	Principal & VPs's Report & Update	Admin	<ul> <li>Principal Update</li> <li>VP Updates</li> </ul>	Ms. FinePrimary update is on "Reading for Explicit Change", a staff driven initiative to support staffengagement + learning re: ant-racism + anti-oppression. Has taken place for the past 2years. A smaller working committee identifies resources for staff to access fordevelopment and learning. Committee is sharing resources with the Black StudentAlliance who play an important role in sharing student voices and perspectives for thebenefit of staff. The student group THRIVE will be coming out with a Wellness survey andone of the proposed questions is on Reading for Explicit Change. The goal is to measurestudents' awareness around teacher engagement. Having both THRIVE and BSAinvolvement is important in providing student leadership and voices, and is greatly valuedby staff and admin.Mr. Edwards:COVID – both MV + RCI are doing well with no active cases. Dec 2 <sup>nd</sup> event: TDSB has sentcommunication on an info session facilitated by TPH (Toronto Public Health) re:

vaccinations for ages 5-11. TPH Mobile Vaccination Clinic came earlier in the Fall for 1 <sup>st</sup>
vaccination for RCI students with intention for it to return for 2 <sup>nd</sup> vaccinations - timing is TBD by TPH.
Supply Teachers – continues to be a challenge to have sufficient specialists at the
secondary level across the board. Re: teaching + learning evaluations – held a successful virtual parent teacher interviews
held in early Nov; Mid-term report cards issued. In January + July have scheduled review of grades with guidance, teaching leads, and teachers to support student success.
Continue to keep awareness on grade review looking at courses code by code, keeping in
mind context of the last 18 mos . Focus is on continuing to identify how to support the students as they go through the curriculum across the grades; A potential idea from the
Head of the Math department (Sam Garrison) – having senior students excelling in math help the grades 9/10.
Some student/staff fun – last week lunch-time dodge ball game. Good for Morale.
Semester 2 – continuing to move ahead assuming this will go forward as 4 courses daily; Expect a clear message from the Board by early January if not earlier.
Of 476 students – 67 are virtual – don't expect this to change significantly as TDSB moves
into a regular 4 courses/day semester schedule in Semester 2.
Questions:
Q. Several related to Grade 12 math and concerns of potential impact to student learning due toinstructor absence over several weeks and subsequent difficulty with obtaining qualified secondary school level specialists.
A. Solution will be forthcoming within the week – an experienced senior grade (11/12)
teacher will be stepping in. Accommodations to be looked at in acknowledging the impact
to student learning and considering possible paths forward to ensure student success in this class and in subsequent classes in Semester 2 and into post-secondary. Mr. Edwards
will explore how to ensure effective messaging is communicated to affected students + families.
Q. Will there be exams this year? How will grade 12 students be prepared for university
exams if there are none ? (No exams since first semester grade 10 for current Gr 12 cohort).
A. Government has decreed no exams in Semester 1. No confirmation yet for Semester 2, although would create an inconsistency to have exams in S2 and not S1. Mr. Edwards to

Best to assume not much and anything there should be used soon as not supposed to have carry over from year to year. Mr. Edwards confirmed the funding from the TDSB (based on # of students) is \$575. Fundraising Discussion: At Secondary School level fundraising is student driven and program specific vs junior/middle school. TDSB doesn't allow fundraising that doesn't use CashOnline – a challenge for student fund-raising activities by RUSTCO etc. Teacher Wish List distributed by Mr. Edwards to key executive positions. Robynne to review with Jen + teacher lead (Karen McCrimmon) – possible synergy is yearbook which is important to students/RUSTCO + Teachers. Cost ~\$12K to produce. Historically funded with Student Activity Fee which was not collected this year (COVID) yet Staff desire is for all students (476) to receive a yearbook given the challenges of the last 2 years. Robynne to coordinate letter with unique direct donation link to target parents/guardians. Timing TBD. Consider the timing of any fundraising asks with Robotics to ensure not confusing RCI Community. Kieran Mills (RCI Tech Lead) submitted application for Best Buy Grant. Expect to hear results in mid-January. Thank you to Jackie for forwarding the grant to the school. PRO – short deadline – Carla to ask MV if they would be willing to co-write the proposal with RCI for a joint event. Jackie available to help draft.
