Admin	<ul> <li>Principal Update</li> <li>VP Updates</li> </ul>	Mr. Edwards: Thank you to School council for all their efforts to support the school and for the staff appreciation lunch (Dec 16th,2021).  Staff changes – absence of main math teacher (Nov 22 on); were able to hire a math qualified teacher (Trevor Wang) who has started already (Jan 23) – Mr. Sam Garrison is department head and supporting him + the three classes he is teaching) and the other teachers.  Natasha Sulej is teaching geography for Semester 2 for Torie Gervais who is on Mat leave. Office area – Ms. Maria Puca-Sorella who has been the Office Administrator has accepted a new position with Continuing Education. Ms. Nabila Anwari is acting in that position for now. New OA will be announced in the next few weeks.  Semester 1 final reports distributed within next week via email. Teachers are in process of submitting to office for review. Marks are vetted by the office - in particular any marks below a certain range. The Ontario government stipulated the final mark for Semester 1 included only marked work up to and including Dec 17th - any work that was submitted post Dec 17th can only improve the final mark of the student – it cannot bring the student's mark down.  TDSB and schools are aware that due to COVID challenges, certain subjects such as sciences and maths may not be covering all the expected grade 12 curriculum material.  RCI wants to give students the opportunity to cover some of this material outside of the formal classes – teachers and admin are meeting to discuss how this might be accomplished + will be communicating to students + families in the coming weeks.

			COVID – screening is ongoing; a concern that the admin would like parents to be aware of students are gathering during breaks (mid-morning/afternoon + lunch) and not all students are maintaining social distancing. Would appreciate parents support in reminding students of the needs of physical distancing particularly during lunch time as we move into Semester 2 with all 400 students in the building at the same time (with ~67 virtual). If a student who has a covid diagnosis, the classmates + families will be advised there is a positive case.  Semester 2 – return to the regular schedule of 4 classes per day. The only change is that the afternoon class schedule flips between days (periods 3 and 4 flip). Targeting extracurricular coming back post March Break at 50% capacity – however this is a provincial call, not a TDSB call. Some programs are meeting virtually such as Robotics, RUSTCO, BSA. Waiting to hear back on sports teams.  Planning for next year has begun. Next year grade 9 classes – 120 applications; Enrollment and staffing look strong for 2022.  Lockers: have been assigned to all  Breakfast program is starting on Thursday – encouraged to eat snack in cafeteria before class or hold snack to lunch for cafeteria.  Reminder of late starts last 2 Wednesdays of every month for staff related meetings.  Some students volunteering in office to answer phones etc as a way of earning volunteer hours and may consider opening this to Mountview, dependent upon COVID restrictions lightening etc.
6. School Council Bylaw Update	Jackie	• Executive Positions open	TDSB advised that school council bylaws needed to be updated. Biggest changes: dealing with conflict.  Jackie + Jen (co-chairs) reviewed RCI's existing bylaws (almost 3 years old) against new ones.  Co-Chairs are recommending that RCI Council accept the new by-laws fully rather than trying to pick and choose between existing ones and new ones as any review to remove duplication created by combining the 2 bylaws would take a long time. Schools do not have the option of rejecting or modifying the new bylaws.  Will post a copy of the new by-laws on the website when they are available and advise the RCI community when they are available for parents to review.  Next Steps: RCI Community asked to review the new by-laws when available and come to the March RCI Council meeting with any clarifying questions they may have about the

				bylaws. Attendees of the March meeting will be asked to vote to accept the Co-Chairs recommendation of accepting the new by-laws as a replacement of the existing bylaws.

11. Other Items	PRO Grant update – Jackie met with MV however determined there were no opportunities for RCI + MV to make a join submission given the tight timelines. No PRO Grant submission was made. Request made to RCI Admin to provide feedback to TDSB that timelines of a few weeks to make submissions are too tight for Student Councils and request an extended timeline.
	Questions:
	Q: Are there HEPA filters in the cafeteria? Answer: No. RCI has a mechanical filter system that serves the whole school (library and guidance area and main office also have a/c which can act as an extra mechanism, to recirculate air. Board prioritized filter placements based on classroom sizes and frequency of classroom use. Certain common areas within the school do not yet have filters (cafeteria, pool, gym, auditorium). RCI has requested an additional 7 filters – TDSB has allocated 3 more and requesting permission to use school budget to purchase remaining 4 required.
	Q: Any update on graduation ceremonies?  Answer: Grad – in person 75% probability and 25% virtual; planning scheduled to start by the end of February with staff and 1-2 School council members to kick it off
	Q: If students haven't been assigned a locker, who should they see? Answer: Please see Icilda Elliston or go to the office.
