TPL Update

Hadley & Sadaf, Youth Hub Librarians from Jane/Dundas location (previous reps have moved on)

What is the youth hub?

- 20 TPLs in the city have youth hubs location based on a variety of factors
- Available at our location
- Teens only, no adults or younger children
- Available M-F from 3:30-7
- Freedom to hang
- Staff member always present
- Dedicated youth focused staff person onsite (either Hadley or Sadaf)
- Goal is to foster strong positive relationships with each other, as well as adults at school, home, library
- Homework help, socializing, general conversation
- Healthy snacks, laptops available to borrow
- Free printing for teens only (no adults)
- Craft supplies, board games, playstation(!)

What's New

- New, staff-led, programs starting September 20, continuing every week until October 18
 - Tuesdays: Board Game Nights
 - o Thursdays: Crafternoons
- Technically programs run from 4-6 p.m. but students can arrive early.

Administration Update

Truth & Reconciliation Day (Rosalie Fine)

- Friday, September 30
- Working on education and awareness for students (why we wear orange).
- Thursday Sept 29 & Friday Sept 30 will be videos in classes and two teachers will run info sessions on Friday during lunch
- Long-term hope will be to have an official TRC club led by students

Nutrition (Rosalie)

- Breakfast program is now up and running
- Grab and Go, packaged. Extras are available in the office.
- New! Hot breakfast will be available starting once per week (early October start TBD)
- Available before 9 a.m.
- Students are strongly encouraged to bring their own water bottles! Refill stations are available around the school.

Parent question: how aware are we with student nutrition deficits and food insecurity? Learning Opportunity Index (LOI) provides the most accurate information on this. Confirmed there is food insecurity at RCI and we get funding for this program.

- Nutrition coordinator who works with the school.
- No questions are asked for food needs.
- Per Rosalie, the school has tried a dry goods pantry but it has not worked well in the past. (Foods not culturally diverse, heavy canned goods, etc.)
- Grocery cards are not an option (these were only available during covid)
- Coupons are often available (very successful)

Parent question: is the school looking for food donations? No, thank you. The school receives enough food for this program.

"Changemakers" team will be coordinating a food drive before Thanksgiving.

Athletic (Rosalie)

- Programs due to start up shortly:
 - Boys volleyball
 - Girls ultimate
 - Cross country
 - Girls bball (not a great response) but one of the teachers is looking at starting a casual intramural league

Facilities (Albert)

- Pool is still not operational
- Need to outsource repair due to the location with is a confined space and need proper training to access
- Process to make these arrangements is complex
- Maybe end of calendar year at best but doubtful

Scheduling / Staffing (Albert)

- Timetable challenges continue and changes are expected. Thank you for your patience.
- Have hired someone to help resolve and finalize expected changes. Many schools are dealing with this, not just RCI.
- New scheduling platform (Power School) has been difficult to learn and to use. Training continues.
- Grade 9 enrolment was expected to be 100 but there were 140. We are now hovering around 500 enrolment (projection was 450). Planning dept is normally very accurate.
- Grade 9s and 10s will most likely be impacted by class reassignments.
- Some low enrolment classes (single digits) may need to be cancelled if no additional allocation is received.
- Some discussion around staffing allocation. Current allocation is 25 teachers.

Parent question: Did we lose two teachers at the end of the last school year? Answer: no. Parent question: Do we have the same number of resource teachers? Clarification - our special education allocation (number of sections offered) was reduced by half - we still run GLE (Learning Strategies course for students with IEPs), and we still have Resource, but not open every period.

Parent question: How are we preparing / supporting teachers for split and large classes such as gym? (this was the example) Answer: Hoping to repurpose an aquatic allocation to assist. Focus on Universal Design for Learning in all classes.

STEM@Runn (Albert)

- Equity of Access to Learning update: Students in STEM or Masters program will no longer be cohorted going forward, and also due to staffing requirements
- "Universal Design for Learning" framework will be used to allow students to engage in subject material at their level.
- Information will be available shortly.

Many questions around this from Masters program parents. Further questions to come. Need to help students and parents understand these changes.

Why are the STEM program students still focusing on "unfinished learning"?

Can be demotivating to these students who enrolled in the program for a higher learning opportunity.

Urban Priority High Schools (UPHS) (Albert)

- RCI has been identified as a UPHS.
- Started in ~2007
- Ministry provides a lump sum to the Boards to distribute as indicated. Runnymede to receive \$100,000.
- Ministry held a 3rd party audit to reimagine criteria and provide more equity
- Rough estimate: 7 returning as UPHS and 7 new added
- Will be a steering committee to determine how to use the funds and one parent representative is required. No volunteers at this meeting.

Parent question: can we refer to last year's Direct Donation Campaign to revisit list of needs? \$2,900 of a \$10,000 goal raised last year.

List of needs (developed by teachers):

- 1. Yearbook Subsidy: Students have been asked to purchase a yearbook for \$20.00, but this does not cover the cost to produce it.
- 2. Specialized Furniture: To create more wellness spaces for students to sit comfortably in a relaxed setting to socialize and work.
- 3. Human Torso Model: New inclusive models will lead to valuable learning in countless classes to come.
- 4. Diversity & Inclusion Activities: Let's continue our leading work with new Pride flags and signage that demonstrates our inclusiveness.

Parent question: how is the school able to use the funds? Things or programs? Answer: 2% may be used for "things" (i.e. furniture may not apply) We can use it for staff development programs, teacher enrichment (not salaries, of course)

Treasury (Albert)

• Approximately \$44.41 in our account. More discussion to come.
